Councillor Reports - March Council Meeting

D. Cllr Lury

My first budget at Arun was one based on financial prudence and has resulted in cutting the budget deficit from £5.2 million two years ago to just £1.88 million achieved by approving £1.5 million of savings in 2024/2025 and by freezing non - essential growth for two years. The implementation of the policy of charging a council tax premium on second homes will increase income by £350 k or free up homes that often stand empty! Several other Financial Strategy workstreams are well under way, including an asset review and the retendering of the waste contract leading me to believe that we will be able to deliver further savings in 2025/2026 . Council tax next year will be increased by 2.99 % next year equating to an extra £6.23 per year or roughly just under 12 pence per week for an average Band D property for Arun services.

Local government reorganisation continues to occupy some of my time as we look to find the most advantageous unitary solution for Arun being mindful that compromise may be needed to ensure agreement cross - councils all seeking to protect their own interests with tax base and data vital to convince Government of an area 's viability as a unitary, given that future savings are seen as the driving force for unitarisation of authorities.

28th February – Meeting with Community Clerk, Jacqui and John to discuss Playscheme, Men's Club idea and possible Half Term Activities. Jacqui will liaise with Bersted Green Hub to confirm booking the dates for the Playscheme and also discussed availability of Jubilee Hall for the Easter half term to run a session. June has some further links to make regarding what if anything, is already running a Men's group, so this is still being looked into.

6th March – bumped into Dominique Willson while I was volunteering with FSW and had a brief conversation about the residents at Bersted Green Court, concerns raised with isolation and risk of being victims of fraud.

-Meeting with Katie (Headmistress of Bersted green School) – I met with Katie to discuss the financial support we are giving them for the families who struggle with food costs. She is extremely grateful for what we give them and has said that the need for it is quite substantial at the school. Key points from this were – there is an ever increasing problem with children who access the school around health and hygiene, particularly balanced diets and oral health. Katie said that when she does the next round of vouchers to families she would like to include toothbrush & toothpaste for the children and also look at sending home items so each child can grow a pea plant (pot, pot dish, soil and pea), they have everything except the pots and dishes so this is something I have contacted a large local grower about possibly providing.

I am also looking into support (various), that we can get for the school and creating some strong community links to support this.

I have typed up full notes from this meeting and will share (or have already shared) with relevant Councillors and the Community Action team at our next meeting.

-Online Councillor and Chairman Training Course – The training was fantastic and really informative, I'd suggest anyone who hasn't done it, or not done it in the past couple of years gets themselves on the list to do it.

7th March – popped into office and had a catch up with Community Clerk. Also had a meeting with Councillor Greenway. Fantastic catch up with Community and Deputy Clerk around 6th March activities, very supportive and informative as always

Meeting with Councillor Greenway - I approached Keir as I know he has had a strong commitment to Bersted Green School, we discussed all of the things that came from my meeting with Katie and both agreed that action was needed. He is kindly going to organise a meeting with the two of us and someone from the Children and Family Centre so that we can work on building a positive and supportive relationship between them and the school. After our meeting he kindly went to Tescos and purchased toothbrushes and toothpaste and delivered these to the school – so thank you again Keir

10th March – Meeting with Councillor Lury and Dominique Willson regarding Bersted Green Hub. This was a great meting and I really appreciated both Martin and Dominique taking time to discuss concerns about The Hub not being utilised to it's, best regarding creating a community space that all can access. It is clear that residents from Bersted Green Court have found there is less for them to do there which has heightened social isolation. Going forward we would all like to see it becoming a community asset for those in the Bersted Green area again including residents and children from the school. Martin has an action plan on organising some meetings to gain further information and/or insight that will support moving this situation forward in the best way for the building itself and the local residents who relied on it.
